About the Fenton Community Orchestra

The Fenton Community Orchestra was founded in August 2010 by three Fenton residents who wanted the opportunity to play in a multi-generational orchestra. Now in its fourteenth season, the FCO organization has more than 130 orchestra members and includes a second group for novice students - Simply Strings. The orchestras perform to thousands of audience members every year. FCO is a regional organization with musicians from Fenton, Lake Fenton, Bancroft, Brighton, Clarkston, Columbiaville, Davisburg, Davison, Durand, Freeland, Flint, Flushing, Goodrich, Grand Blanc, Hartland, Holly, Howell, Lennon, Linden, Owosso, Perry, Rochester Hills, Saginaw, Shelby Twp., St. Johns, Swartz Creek, Vassar and other communities.

Since the inception of the FCO, more than 325 musicians have performed with its ensembles.

HISTORIC HIGHLIGHTS

 Since its founding in 2010, the FCO has grown from 30 musicians to over 130 members.
 FCO musicians range in age from 14 to 90.

 In the past 13 years, over 41,000 community members enjoyed FCO offerings through concerts, events and activities.

The FCO's commitment to education is shown by our Simply Strings programs, past performances at local schools, and our participation in the 2023 statewide music educators conference.

PANDEMIC RECOVERY

The FCO and Simply Strings have rebounded robustly from COV-19. Season 13 saw the organization following the health policies of Fenton Area Public Schools, who in turn followed the Genesee County Health Department. Masking and vaccinations were optional, while members who were exposed followed the necessary guidelines to protect their fellow musicians. Our membership numbers are now similar to what they were before the pandemic. Also, pre-pandemic practices such as concert receptions and our donor Afterglow have been reinstated.







SEASON 13 SUMMARY

The FCO's Season Thirteen provided many opportunities for musicians and community members to be inspired and engaged in the arts. We also represented greater Fenton on a statewide level at the Michigan Music Conference in Grand

Rapids, where a combined ensemble of the FCO and Simply Strings served as the demonstration group for Music Director

Andrew Perkins' educational session: Weird FLEX, but ok - Making Flexible
Arrangements WORK for your Ensemble. The FCO hosted an audience of more than 3,000 attendees between our December & April concerts held at Fenton High School, our annual Concert in the Park, and the MMC in Grand Rapids.

Simply Strings, Summer Strings and Saturday Strings introduced new

members to our organization, giving them a relaxed environment in which to further their skills in a group environment under the tutelage of string pedagogue Jane Ball. These ensembles provided less experienced musicians a platform to learn, grow and perform music. They also allowed the FCO string members to have another group to perform with, also serving as mentors to our novice musicians. The FCO also participated in local community events such as the Fenton Ghost Walk, Jingle Fest and the July Art Walk. We also partnered with the Fenton High School Jazz Ensemble at the Southern Lakes Parks and Recreation Concert in the Park Series.




